<u>Instead of putting donations on the front table we are now using the BASKETS located along the south wall of the Hall - under the bulletin board.</u>

Black Forest Cares: We pass a container for monetary donations at meetings or you may bring non-perishable food or personal care items to the meeting when we meet at the church. They also need plastic or paper bags to put groceries in. **BASKET** for food.

Black Forest Lutheran Church: Containers with lids that are suitable to hold liquids, but can be used for food items, need to be 16 oz. or larger - either plastic or glass. They take them to the Marion House Soup Kitchen. Pennies to Mosaic, they do add up. **BASKET**

Gently used or new bath towels for migrant bags & shampoos/soaps from hotels - an ongoing need.

St. Jude is again using card fronts for a project. The church has a **BASKET** we can put them in. They want the front only. There should be no writing on the back of the front. Disney, Hallmark & American Greeting cards can't be used because of copyright issues.

Wolford School: Boxtops for Education - they now have an expiration date on them. The container to put these in is on the table by the name tags.

The Art Teacher can use paper egg cartons and the foam meat and bakery/cupcake trays for paint trays. Kindergarten teachers love to receive picture stamps we receive from organizations. They cannot use religious ones. Leave Boxtops and items for teachers on the collection table.

Ronald McDonald House: The aluminum pull tabs from drinks, cat food or any aluminum pull tab. They receive funding by the weight of the tabs. BASKET

Share Table at monthly meetings: Items members have that they do not need & are willing to share with others. If you can use the item please take it with you. If they have been out at 2 meetings we will donate to an organization or person may take them back.

You may bring items to our meeting & the Community Service Committee will deliver to organizations needing them.
